



The 5th Csángó Festival in Poland will take place in Torun on 11th-13th October

Join us in Torun on 11th to 13th of October to experience the unique atmosphere of the in Csángó Festival in Poland. More than 20 diverse events await participants, including energetic music, dancing and singing. More than 30 artists from at least four countries will provide almost 30 hours of unforgettable emotions. Poland is a celebration of Polish-Hungarian friendship, joined by other nationalities and social groups. The festival presents traditional folk music played on traditional instruments and in the manner handed down by the masters according to the methods of the Hungarian Dance Houses listed as Intangible Cultural Heritage by UNESCO since 2011. It will host some of the most outstanding Hungarian, Polish and Ukrainian musicians and dancers, who hope to bring a better destiny to the world through music, dances and other arts, and the organisers believe that traditional culture and the dance house movement will change people's world view, give well-being and create a better community.

Yurt, cruise ... and what else on the agenda

On Friday morning, we will arrange the festival space, prepare the stage in the yurt, set up tungsten lighting, and decorate the main dance hall with large pictures of landscapes and photos of the Csángós' life to create the atmosphere of the place. Starting on Friday afternoon, there will be sessions of learning csángó dances and songs from Moldva and Gyimes, as well as playing instruments primarily violin and flutes, but you can also try playing the koboz lute and gardon and drum. This will be followed by the official opening of the Festival - we will invite you to a tasting of high-quality Hungarian specialities and a concert with the theme of csángó music, in which we will present the most traditional style of performance, highlighting the indigenous Czango performers: 84-year-old flute master András Hodorog, violinist István Luki Lukács and dancer and drummer Katyi Gyula. The concert will be followed by the opening of an exhibition of photographs by a Hungarian artist from Transylvania. Gyula Ádám has immortalised the csángó people in order to preserve this unique culture from oblivion. The final highlight of the evening will be the táncház, or dance party, where traditional Czango folk music will be played alternately with Polish folk music until 2am. We also invite the most traditional Polish musicians willing to play Czango melodies together.

On Saturday (after a quick snooze), classes for beginners and advanced musicians will continue throughout the day. The Saturday evening concert will be a musical journey from Moldova through the Carpathian Mountains to Kuyavia and Pomerania - primarily the Roman Kumlyk Hutsul Czeremosz band will perform, as well as the Mielcarek Iwan Niwiński Trio, Kazimierz Nitkiewicz; Chełmińska Band; Środa Kujawska singing group; and instrumentation will include: dulcimer, bassetla, trumpet and clarinet. Then dancing until dawn, again alternating between Polish, Ukrainian and Hungarian music. After Sunday Mass, there will be a meeting in the Cathedral church looking for connections between Polish and Hungarian saints. At the end of the festival, we invite you to another cruise on a musical raft carrying



Polish and csángó melodies. We would also like to invite you to warm up in Gdańsk, where a workshop and dance party will be held on Thursday 10.10 in the Paszcza Iwa in Oliwa. Detailed information and tickets are available at czango.pl/en

The uniqueness of the Festival

Close, natural, together; ethno&eko, or how? All of the musical festival events will be without an artificial sound system, the stage will not be distant or too elevated above the audience, so the music will be heard from a traditional distance. This implies the intimate nature of the event. Other features of our event include a traditional set of instruments, a relaxed old-fashioned pace, concern for the environment, healthy, good quality local food, no air-conditioning, no advertising, no products of many global companies, no fast food, no afterburners or energy drinks, etc. While at the concert we play with an old-fashioned instrumental line-up, during the dance part (táncház) we put this principle aside in favour of playing with our Polish friends and a wide range of instruments. In the invited musicians, dancers and visitors we value authenticity in táncház movement, civic and Christian values and behaviour, referring to each other with respect, without swearing.

Maintaining traditions in everyday life is important - it brings nationalities together - in addition, mixed areas such as that inhabited by Csángós (now an area of eastern Romania) and the entire Carpathian region help us to understand humanity and set an example of how to live in peace and harmony. Everything can be found in folklore, each nation has its own history deeply inscribed in its cultural heritage, which we want to discover and enrich our lives and relationships, the organisers explain.

Organisers

The Polish musicians are organised and selected by Asia Mieszkowicz of the Aeris Futuro Foundation, and the Hungarian musicians by Gergely Sámsondi and Farkas Gyulai of the Szépszerével band. As long-standing members of the dance house movement, the organisers know everyone and are on good terms with them, which is why they are able to organise interesting venues and dance halls across the country and invite excellent musicians to events. We cooperate with more than 20 entities, a large part of them from Toruń, without whom this Festival would not succeed.
